3. **Consider the approval of the Minutes** of the September 25, 2025, regular meeting of the Texas Transportation Commission

4. **Contracts**

Consider the award or rejection of contracts for highway construction and maintenance, and construction and rehabilitation of buildings (Presentation)

These proposed minute orders contain information concerning the receipt of bids for highway improvement contracts. The Texas Department of Transportation may reschedule receipt of bids for those projects where the Texas Transportation Commission (commission) rejects all bids. Those bids accepted by the commission will result in conditional contract awards to the low bidders. Contract award conditions may involve securing funding from other sources, the contractor's ability to satisfy federal DBE subcontracting requirements, or other requirements as outlined in the project bid proposal.

a. **Highway Improvements and Other Transportation Facilities (MO)**

c. **Construction and Rehabilitation of Buildings (MO)**

Rescind award of and reject TRAVIS COUNTY Project ID No. 42-470424533, for the New Hanger & Ramp Rehab, TxDOT Flight Services, previously awarded July 31, 2025, by Minute Order 116972 (see attached itemized list). It is necessary to rescind the previous award of TRAVIS COUNTY Project ID No. 42-470424533 for the New Hanger & Ramp Rehab, TxDOT Flight Services, and reject all bids on the respective project in the best interest of the state.

5. **Aviation**

Various Counties - Consider the award of federal non-primary entitlement grant funding, federal apportionment grant funding, Infrastructure and Investment Jobs Act grant funding, and state grant funding for airport improvement projects at various locations (MO)

Federal law authorizes the award of federal non-primary entitlement grant funding, federal apportionment grant funding, and Infrastructure and Investment Jobs Act grant funding to preserve and improve the state's general aviation system. State law authorizes the award of state grant funding for capital improvement projects.

6. **State Infrastructure Bank**

Cameron County - Military Highway Water Supply Corporation - Consider final approval of a request from Military Highway Water Supply Corporation for a State Infrastructure Bank loan in the amount of up to \$9,000,000 for the cost of utility relocation necessary for a non-tolled, on-system project to widen SH 281 in Cameron County, Texas (Presentation) (MO)

Military Highway Water Supply Corporation (WSC) will secure the loan with a pledge of utility revenues. The loan will be used to pay the WSC's cost of utility relocation necessary for a non-tolled, on-system project to widen SH 281 in Cameron County, Texas.

7. **Municipal Utility Relocation Reimbursement**
Starr County - Consider the approval of a request from the city of Roma (city) to make the relocation of the city's utility facilities required by the FM 650 highway improvement project an expense of the state under Transportation Code §203.092(a-4) (MO)
Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 21, Subchapter B, §21.25 sets forth the requirements for a utility to qualify for reimbursement under this program. Payment for this relocation will not cause the Texas Department of Transportation to exceed \$10 million in any fiscal year. The utility is a political subdivision with a financial condition that prevents the utility from being able to pay the cost in full or in part or, if paid at that time, the payment would adversely affect the utility's ability to operate or provide essential services to its customers. The utility is unable to receive a state infrastructure bank loan to finance the cost of the relocation and is otherwise unable to finance that cost.
8. **Eminent Domain Proceedings**
Various Counties - Consider the authorization of the filing of condemnation proceedings to acquire real property by eminent domain for non-controlled and controlled access highways (see attached itemized list) (MO)
Texas Transportation Commission findings, determinations, and authorizations for the state, by motion made in accordance with Senate Bill 18, 82nd Legislature, Regular Session, 2011, to acquire by eminent domain, upon the payment of adequate and just compensation, various ownership interests in specific parcels of real property that are needed to develop or improve both non-controlled and controlled access state highways, to include requesting the state attorney general to bring and pursue condemnation suits relating to those specific parcels of real property described in the attached itemized list.
9. **Routine Minute Orders and Reports**
a. **Donations to the Department**
Various Districts - Consider the acknowledgment of donations with a value of \$500 or more, including donations of money, materials, services, or real property, that are made to the Texas Department of Transportation (department) for the purpose of assisting the department in carrying out its functions and duties or for improving access to or from a highway on the state highway system (see attached itemized list) (MO)
State statutes require the Texas Transportation Commission (commission) to acknowledge the acceptance of a gift to the Texas Department of Transportation that is valued at \$500 or more. By the adoption of this minute order, the commission acknowledges the receipt and acceptance of the property specified in the minute order.

9. **Routine Minute Orders and Reports (continued)**

b. **Real Estate Dispositions**

The Texas Transportation Commission must approve the sales, transfers, and exchanges of state rights of way and other real properties that are no longer needed for a state highway purpose. It must also approve, accept, and acknowledge donations to the state of real property that is valued at \$500 or more.

- (1) **Bexar County** - Culebra Road - Consider the sale of right of way to the city of San Antonio, Texas (MO)
The district has recommended that the Texas Transportation Commission determine that the land is no longer needed for highway purposes. The city of San Antonio (city) has requested to purchase the land, and it may be sold to the city.
- (2) **Llano County** - RM 2147 - Consider the rescission of Minute Order 116618, dated December 12, 2023, authorizing the release of an easement to the underlying fee owner (MO)
The counterparty failed to provide payment required to complete the release of the easement.
- (3) **San Patricio County** - SH 361 - Consider the rescission of Minute Order 116902, dated February 27, 2025, authorizing the sale of right of way to an abutting landowner (MO)
The counterparty failed to provide payment required to complete the acquisition of the real property.
- (4) **Tom Green County** - South Orient Railroad - Consider the sale of railroad right of way to an abutting landowner (MO)
The district has recommended that the Texas Transportation Commission determine that the land is no longer needed for Texas Department of Transportation purposes. An abutting landowner has requested to purchase the land, and it may be sold to the requester.
- (5) **Wilson County** - US 181 - Consider an easement release to the underlying fee owner (MO)
The district has recommended that the Texas Transportation Commission determine that the easement is no longer needed for highway purposes. The easement may be released to the underlying fee owner.
- (6) **Wise County** - BU 380 - Consider the removal from the system, transfer of jurisdiction, control, and maintenance, and transfer of right of way to the city of Decatur, Texas (MO)
The district has recommended that the Texas Transportation Commission determine that a segment of roadway is no longer needed as part of the state highway system. The city of Decatur (city) has agreed to assume jurisdiction, control, and maintenance and has requested that the right of way be transferred to the city. The right of way may be transferred to the city without cost to remain in use for public road purposes and will revert to the state if it ceases to be used for public road purposes.

c. **Reports**

(1) **Compliance Division Report**

State law requires the Texas Transportation Commission (commission) to establish a compliance program, which must include a Compliance Division to oversee the program. The Compliance Division is responsible for acting to prevent and detect serious breaches of Texas Department of Transportation (department) policy, fraud, waste, and abuse of office, including any acts of criminal conduct within the department. The Compliance Division is required to provide a monthly report to the commission regarding investigations and a summary of information relating to trends and recommendations.

(2) **Letting Allocation Report**

Quarterly report on the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 letting allocation, the actual allocation utilized through the quarter, and proposed remaining highway maintenance and construction contract letting for the fiscal year (Report)

This report will provide the current overall allocation status, by district and metropolitan planning organization, of the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 letting allocation and will also provide the anticipated effect on the letting allocation of remaining proposed highway maintenance and construction letting.

(3) **Quarterly Cash Report**

Quarterly report on Fiscal Year 2025 State Highway Fund 6 cash activity (Report)

This report updates the Texas Transportation Commission on the year-to-date cash balance and activity of Fund 6. The report will include original projections and actual revenues/inflows and expenditures/outflows on a cash basis.

(4) **CTTS Annual Toll Rate Escalation Report**

Travis and Williamson Counties - Report of the toll rate escalation percentage and escalated toll rates for the Central Texas Turnpike System, consisting of the SH 130 (Segments 1-4), SH 45N, Loop 1 (from FM 734 to SH 45N), and SH 45SE project elements (Report)

This report provides the toll rate escalation percentage increase and the annual escalated toll rates for the Central Texas Turnpike System. The Texas Transportation Commission's (commission) Toll Rate Escalation Policy requires that a percentage increase in the toll rates will be determined and reported to the commission each year at or before the commission's October meeting, and that the percentage increase in the toll rates shall be effective automatically on January 1 of the next calendar year unless the commission modifies the percentage prior to January 1.

 - (5) **Grand Parkway (SH 99) Annual Toll Rate Escalation Report Various Counties** - Report of the toll rate escalation percentage and escalated toll rates for portions of SH 99 (Grand Parkway) consisting of the tolled portion of Segment D in Harris County, Segments E, F-1, F-2, G, H, I-1, and I-2 (Report)
This report provides the toll rate escalation percentage increase and the annual escalated toll rates for the tolled portion of Grand Parkway Segment D in Harris County and for Segments E, F-1, F-2, G, H, I-1, and I-2. The Transportation Commission's (commission) Toll Rate Escalation Policy requires that a percentage increase in the toll rates will be determined and reported to the commission each year at or before the commission's October meeting, and that the percentage increase in the toll rates shall be effective automatically on January 1 of the next calendar year unless the commission modifies the percentage prior to January 1.
 - (6) **SH 249 Annual Toll Rate Escalation Report Grimes and Montgomery Counties** - Report of the toll rate escalation percentage and escalated toll rates for the SH 249 System, comprised of Segment 1 of the SH 249 Project extending SH 249 from FM 1774 in Pinehurst to FM 1774 in Todd Mission (Report)
This report provides the toll rate escalation percentage increase and the annual escalated toll rates for the SH 249 System in Grimes and Montgomery counties. The Texas Transportation Commission's (commission) Toll Rate Escalation Policy requires that a percentage increase in the toll rates will be determined and reported to the commission each year at or before the commission's October meeting, and that the percentage increase in the toll rates shall be effective automatically on January 1 of the next calendar year unless the commission modifies the percentage prior to January 1.
 - d. **Finance**
 - Central Texas Turnpike System Toll Rates Travis and Williamson Counties** - Consider adopting a change in toll rates for certain vehicles on SH 130 (Segments 1-4) and SH 45SE project elements of the Central Texas Turnpike System (MO)
This minute order adopts a change in toll rates for certain vehicles on SH 130 (Segments 1-4) and SH 45SE, to be consistent with other project elements of the Central Texas Turnpike System.
 - e. **Designation of Access Control Brazoria County** - SH 288, north of Bailey Avenue, in the city of Manvel - Consider the designation of one location on the southbound frontage road of SH 288 at which access will be permitted to the abutting property (MO)
The designation of one 40-foot break in the control-of-access line will allow the abutting landowner to open one commercial driveway for access to and from the southbound frontage road of SH 288. The district has determined that access may be permitted at the designated location.

f. **Speed Zones**
