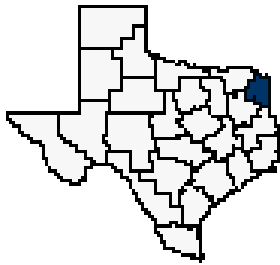


DISTRICT PROFILE

The Atlanta District plans, designs, builds, operates and maintains the state transportation system in its nine counties. The district primarily conducts asset preservation and mobility projects to ensure the safety of the traveling public. The Atlanta district experiences varying weather conditions from extreme heat to sub-freezing temperatures, which result in varying challenges for maintenance crews and designers in order to maintain district assets and assure the safety of the traveling public year-round.

KEY PROJECTS UNDERWAY:

- I-30 in Bowie County: widen highway to six lanes in Texarkana and extend frontage roads – \$147,671,288
- SH 155 in Marion and Upshur Counties: replace bridge and approaches at Lake O' the Pines – \$53,799,919
- US 82 in Bowie County: widen existing highway from I-30 to US 259 to four lanes – \$95,100,000

PLANNED KEY PROJECTS:

- US 59 Relief Route/Loop 390 in Harrison County: advance planning to extend loop from US 80 to I-20 – \$220,000,000 (Future I-369)
- I-20 in Harrison County: widen highway to six lanes between Hallsville and Marshall – \$161,200,000
- US 82 in Bowie County: widen existing highway from US 259 to Red River Co. line to four lanes - \$74,153,220

MAINTENANCE: The Atlanta District spends \$7 to 10 million annually on seal coating projects and several million each year repaving various highways.

CORRIDORS: The Atlanta District's priority corridor efforts are I-30 in Bowie, Morris and Titus Counties; I-20 through Harrison County; and US 59 as a north/south corridor and future I-369 in Bowie, Cass, Marion, Harrison and Panola Counties.

SAFETY: The Atlanta District's upcoming safety projects include over \$11.3 million dedicated for texturizing shoulders, safety treating fixed objects, guard rail upgrades, safety lighting and others.
