Spotlighting LFK's Traffic Safety Division

The Traffic Safety Division is responsible for many things, including designing and controlling traffic signals, speed zone studies, and crash records and data. But in the Lufkin District, it's about more than the day-to-day business, it's about people. There is a constant effort to reach TxDOT's goal of zero fatalities on Texas roads. To do that, you must reach the people.

The Traffic Safety program in the Lufkin District, led by Melissa McKnight, Traffic Safety Specialist, works daily involving people in a variety of safety campaigns and events that teaches them about safety while having a fun time.

On March 2, a Bike Rodeo was held at Stephen F. Austin State University in partnership with the Evening Pilot Club of Nacogdoches. The event taught adults and children different aspects of bicycle safety including helmet safety, bike inspections, and how to ride safely. TxDOT volunteers were joined by law enforcement and emergency responders who helped throughout the day.



Melissa is invited to speak on a variety of subjects regularly. One event she attends is the ACE IT Driving School. In her presentations, Melissa speaks on impaired driving, the importance of educating teens on the consequences of underage drinking, and distracted driving.

At the 10th annual Touch-A-Truck held recently, businesses offered a close-up look at public safety vehicles including utility, ambulance, fire trucks, and law enforcement. TxDOT was on hand with information about what TxDOT equipment is utilized on the roadways, as well as, how to properly use seatbelts and safety equipment. The event


So, while the business of Traffic Safety each day is necessary, the Lufkin District Traffic Safety employees take business a step

Connecting Texas 2050

Connecting Texas 2050, the latest update to the Statewide Long-Range Transportation Plan (SLRTP), is the cornerstone multimodal transportation planning document at TxDOT. Updated every four years, this plan considers current and future transportation choices and how they integrate as a system to serve Texans and our economy. With Connecting Texas 2050, TxDOT establishes the vision, goals, objectives, performance measures, and strategic recommendations for the state's multimodal transportation system through 2050. Connecting Texas 2050 development kicked off in fall 2022 and will continue through summer 2024.

Below is a timeline for the development of Connecting Texas 2050.




I-69 DEVELOPMENT IN THE LUFKIN DISTRICT

There are currently ten projects that the Lufkin District is actively developing to meet interstate standards. These projects are in varying stages of development from schematic to construction. Below is a brief status on each. For more information on I-69 projects development in the district, please visit our webpage at www.txdot.gov and search "I-69 Projects Overview".


- <u>US 59/SL 224 South Interchange</u> project involves upgrading existing US 59 by constructing new US 59 direct connectors at SL 224(S) and frontage roads along SL 224 between SH 7 and US 59. Construction began in September 2019 and is anticipated to be complete fall 2025, weather permitting.
- <u>US 59 Diboll Relief Route</u> project involves constructing a new location controlled-access roadway
 east of Diboll. Construction began in Spring 2020 and is anticipated to be summer 2025, weather
 permitting.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade Moffett Rd to SH 103</u> this project in Lufkin involves upgrading existing US 59 to a controlled access roadway by adding frontage roads. Construction began in 2021 and scheduled for completion in winter 2024, weather permitting.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade Redland</u> project involves upgrading existing US 59 to a controlled access roadway
 by adding frontage roads between SL 287 and FM 2021. Construction began in late 2022 and is
 anticipated to be completed in fall 2025, weather permitting.
- <u>US 59 Corrigan Relief Route</u> project involves the construction of a new location controlled-access roadway, west of Corrigan. Construction began in fall 2022 and is anticipated to be completed in late winter 2028, weather permitting.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade Shepherd to Cleveland (future I-69)</u> project involves upgrading existing US 59 to a controlled-access roadway by adding frontage roads between FM 2914 and SL 573. Construction began in winter 2023 and is anticipated to be completed in fall 2029.
- US 59/US 259 North Nacogdoches Interchange this project involves upgrading US 59 to a controlled-access roadway from Stallings Drive/SL 224 to 1.3 miles north of US 259 by reconstructing the US 59/US 259 interchange and adding new frontage roads. A public meeting was held on Aug. 3, 2023. Another public meeting will be held in fall 2024. Construction is currently scheduled to begin in 2029.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade Shepherd to Trinity River</u> project involves upgrading existing US 59 to a controlledaccess roadway by adding frontage roads between FM 223 (Church Street) to just north of the Trinity River. TxDOT held a public meeting on April 27, 2023. Construction is currently scheduled to begin in 2029.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade North Livingston</u> project involves upgrading US 59 to a controlled-access roadway by reconstructing the US 59/US 190 interchange, reconstructing US 59 main lanes and frontage roads from just south of US 190 to SL 116. TxDOT is currently working with a consultant on the development of the schematic. A public meeting is tentatively scheduled in winter 2024. Construction is currently scheduled to begin in 2032.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade South Livingston</u> project involves upgrading US 59 to a controlled-access roadway
 by reconstructing the US 59/FM 1988 interchange, reconstructing US 59 main lanes and adding
 frontage roads from just south of US 190 to 0.39 miles south of FM 1988. TxDOT is currently working
 with a consultant on the development of the schematic. A public meeting is tentatively scheduled in
 winter 2024. This project currently does not have construction funding identified.


