SUBCHAPTER H DETERMINATION OF TERMS FOR CERTAIN TOLL

**PROJECTS** 

**RULE §27.90 Purpose** 

Transportation Code, §228.013 requires, for certain department toll projects in which a private entity has a financial interest in the project's performance, that the distribution of the project's financial risk, the method of financing for the project, and the tolling structure and methodology be determined by a committee comprised of representatives from the department, any local toll project entity for the area in which the project is located, the applicable metropolitan planning organization, and each municipality or county that provides revenue or right of way for the project. This subchapter prescribes the process for a committee's issuance of its determination.

## **RULE §27.91** Definitions

The following words and terms, when used in this subchapter, shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

- (1) Availability payment contract--A comprehensive development agreement under which payments are made to a private entity from project and other revenue to compensate the private entity for capital, operating, and financial costs, which may be based on the private entity's performance under the agreement.
- (2) Commission--The Texas Transportation Commission.
- (3) Committee--A committee established under this subchapter.
- (4) Comprehensive development agreement—An agreement with a private entity authorized under Transportation Code, Chapter 223, Subchapter E that, at a minimum, provides for the design and construction, reconstruction, extension, expansion, or improvement of a toll project and may also provide for the financing, acquisition, maintenance, or operation of a toll project.
- (5) Concession agreement—A comprehensive development agreement under which a private entity agrees to develop, finance, and construct a toll project, and to assume operation or maintenance responsibilities for a toll project, in exchange for rights to revenue of the project.
- (6) Department--The Texas Department of Transportation.
- (7) Executive director--The executive director of the department or the executive director's designee.
- (8) Local funds--Funds of a city or county, any other funds paid by a city or county to meet local participation requirements, and money deposited in a subaccount created under Transportation Code, §228.012.

- (9) Local toll project entity--Has the meaning assigned by Transportation Code, §373.001.
- (10) Metropolitan planning organization--The organization or policy board of an organization created and designated under 23 U.S.C. §134 and 49 U.S.C. §5303, as amended, to make transportation planning decisions for a metropolitan planning area in which a toll project is located and to carry out the metropolitan transportation planning process.
  - (11) Toll project--Has the meaning assigned by Transportation Code, §201.001.

# **RULE §27.92** Financial Terms

- (a) Applicability. This subchapter applies only to a department toll project that will be developed under a concession agreement or an availability payment contract, and for which:
- (1) funds allocated to a metropolitan planning organization are expected to be used to pay for project costs;
- (2) local funds are expected to be used to pay for project costs; or
- (3) property of a city or county is expected to be used as project right of way or a city or county is expected to pay for the acquisition of right of way for the project.
- (b) Formation and membership of committee. For a project subject to Transportation Code, Chapter 373, Subchapter B, the committee shall be formed after the department exercises its option under that subchapter to develop, finance, construct, and operate the project. The membership of a committee shall be determined after the commission authorizes the department to initiate a procurement for a toll project that provides for the potential delivery of the project through a concession agreement or an availability payment contract. To be eligible to serve as a committee member, a person must be an elected official or a full-time employee of the represented entity. A committee consists of the following members:
- (1) one member appointed by each metropolitan planning organization within whose boundaries all or part of the proposed project may be located;
- (2) one member appointed by each local toll project entity within whose boundaries all or part of the proposed project may be located;
- (3) one member appointed by each city and county which has:
- (A) provided local funds to pay for right of way acquisition or other project costs or to acquire right of way for the project, or has provided property of the city or county for use as project right of way; or
- (B) submitted to the department an order or resolution adopted by the city council or county commissioners court committing local funds or property to the project; and
- (4) one member appointed by the executive director to represent the department.
- (c) Officers. The committee will, subject to the concurrence of the commission, elect a chair and vice-chair by majority vote of the members of the committee.
- (d) Duties. A committee established under this subchapter shall submit a report to the executive director before the date the department issues a request for qualifications for the toll project, except for a project for which the department and a local toll project entity have agreed on the terms and conditions for the project under Transportation Code, §228.0111, or for which a local toll project entity has waived its option to develop, construct, and operate the project, in which

case the report shall be submitted before the date the department issues a request for proposals for the project. If the project is subject to a market valuation agreement, market valuation waiver agreement, or similar agreement entered into under Transportation Code, §228.0111, or a toll project agreement entered into under Transportation Code, §373.006, the report may not include determinations that are inconsistent with the provisions of the agreement that relate to the determinations to be included in the report. A report shall contain the following determinations:

- (1) the distribution of project financial risk, which is the allocation of revenue risk for a toll project between the department and the private entity with which the department enters into an agreement for the project;
- (2) the method of financing for the project, which is a determination of whether the project should be funded with private or public funding or a combination of private and public funding; and
- (3) unless the project is subject to a regional tolling policy, the project's tolling structure and methodology.
- (e) Failure to submit report. All members of a committee will utilize their best efforts to support the generation of a report. If a committee does not submit a report by the date the department is scheduled to issue a request for qualifications or request for proposals, as applicable, for a project, the department will use any business terms applicable to the project that have been adopted by the metropolitan planning organization and that relate to the determinations to be included in the report.
- (f) Meetings.
- (1) Meeting requirements. The department's Office of General Counsel will submit to the Office of the Secretary of State notice of a meeting of the committee at least eight days before the date of the meeting. The notice will provide the date, time, place, and purpose of the meeting. A meeting of a committee will be open to the public. A committee will follow the agenda set for each meeting under paragraph (2) of this subsection.
- (2) Scheduling of meetings. Meeting dates, times, places, and agendas will be set by the office designated under subsection (g) of this section. Any committee member may suggest an agenda item, provided that the agenda item must be approved by the chair of the committee and the department. A committee's report may only discuss items that are within the committee's jurisdiction. The office designated under subsection (g) of this section will provide notice of the time, date, place, and purpose of meetings to the members, by mail, email, telephone, or any combination of the three, at least eight calendar days before each meeting. All meetings must take place in Texas and must be held in a location that is readily accessible to the general public.
- (3) Committee action. A quorum of the committee is one half or more of the number of members appointed to the committee. A committee may act only by majority vote of the members present at the meeting and voting.
- (4) Record. Minutes of all committee meetings shall be prepared and filed with the executive director. The complete proceedings of all committee meetings must also be recorded by electronic means.
- (5) Public information. All minutes, transcripts, and other records of the committees are records of the department and as such, are subject to disclosure under the provisions of Government Code, Chapter 552.
- (g) Administrative support. For each committee, the executive director will designate an office or division of the department that will be responsible for providing any necessary administrative support essential to the functions of the committee. The department will provide project

information and other information to the committee to assist the committee in carrying out its duties, including the project procurement schedule.

(h) Duration. After a committee submits the report described in subsection (d) of this section, the committee ceases to exist. The department may, in its discretion, reconvene a committee if changed circumstances may result in a change in the committee's determinations.

# SUBCHAPTER H. DETERMINATION OF TERMS FOR CERTAIN TOLL PROJECTS

43 TAC §§27.90 - 27.92

The Texa Department of Tran portation (department) propo e new §27.90, Purpo e, §27.91, Definition , and §27.92, Financial Term , concerning Determination of Term for Certain Toll Project .

#### **EXPLANATION OF PROPOSED NEW SECTIONS**

Tran portation Code, §228.013, added by Senate Bill 1420, 82nd Legi lature, Regular Se ion, 2011, require, for certain department toll project in which a private entity ha a financial intere t in the project' performance, that the di tribution of the project' financial ri k, the method of financing for the project, and the tolling tructure and methodology be determined by a committee compri ed of repre entative from the department, any local toll project entity for the area in which the project i located, the applicable metropolitan planning organization, and each municipality or county that provide revenue or right of way for the project. The propo ed new ection pre cribe the proce for a committee' i uance of it determination.

The new ection define the circum tance in which a committee mu t be e tabli hed and the proce for the i uance of a report containing the committee' determination. The term determined by a committee will affect the project procurement and the term of the comprehen ive development agreement for the toll project. Accordingly, a determination mu t be i ued a oon a practical after a procurement ha been authorized. The new ection only apply to project developed under comprehen ive development agreement. Ba ed on the term of agreement that have been u ed by the department for the development, con truction, and operation of toll project, a private entity will only have a financial intere t in the performance of a project developed under a comprehen ive development agreement.

New §27.90 de cribe the purpo e of the new ection .

New §27.91 define word and term u ed in the new ection.

New §27.92 provide that the new ection only apply to a toll project that will be developed under a conce ion agreement or an availability payment contract. Of the comprehen ive development agreement entered into or contemplated to be entered into by the department, only a conce ion agreement or an avail-

bility p yment controct provides private entity with fin nci linterest in the project's performance.

New §27.92 limits the pplic bility of the new sections to toll project for which funds lloc ted to metropolit n pl nning org niz tion or loc I funds re expected to be used to p y for project costs, property of municip lity or county is expected to be used s project right of w y, or municip lity or county is expected to p y for the cquisition of right of w y for the project. It is in the st te's interest to h ve determin tion issued s soon s possible. It m y not be possible to know with cert inty whether funds lloc ted to metropolit n pl nning org niz tion or city or county funds will be used to p y for project costs. Accordingly, new §27.92 provides th t new Subch pter H of Ch pter 27 pplies if those funds re expected to be used to p y project costs.

Tr nsport tion Code, §228.013 does not define whit funds is dedicted to or controlled by region, municipility, or county. The only funds region I body his responsibility for llociting to depirtment toll projects is rethe funds the Tex sit Tr nsportation Commission (commission). Ilocites to metropolitin plinning orginizations. Funds of city or county that it regions to the municipility or county by the depirtment and not used to meet locity pricipition requirements would not be dedicted to or controlled by the municipility or county. This construction of the stitute is consistent with the depirtment's understinding that the purpose of the stitute is to provide locitinding to the region I stikeholders with its yin project terms that if fect the risk of loss of lociting in the depict of the stitute is to project.

New §27.92 provides that the membership of committee will be determined after the commission uthorizes the department to initiate procurement for toll project subject to the new sections. New §27.92 Iso provides that committee shall submit report to the department's executive director prior to the date the department issues are request for qualifications for toll project, except for project for which the department and local toll project entity have greed on the terms and conditions for the project under Transport tion Code, §228.0111, or for which

loc I toll project entity h s w ived its option to develop, construct, nd oper te the project. For those projects, m ny of the terms to be considered by committee h ve Ire dy been settled. The report for those projects must be submitted prior to the d te the dep rtment issues request for propos Is for the project. The terms determined by committee will ffect the project procurement, the delivery method used, nd the terms of the comprehensive development greement for the toll project. Accordingly, determin tion must be issued a soon as practical fter procurement has been uthorized. Delay in issuing request for qualifications or request for propos Is and entering into an greement for the delivery of toll project will result in ddition I costs and increased congestion because of the delay in completing those needed projects.

In order to h ve determin tion issued s soon s possible, the membership of committee would be determined before it is cle r whether p rticul r entity is required to be represented. New §27.92 provides that committee will be comprised of one member pointed by e chamteropolit n planning organization and local toll project entity within whose bound ries all or part of the proposed project may be located, and one member pointed by each city and county with which the department intends to enter into an agreement under which the city or county will provide local funds to pay for right-of-way cquisition or other project costs or to acquire right of way for the project, or will provide property of the city or county for use a sproject right of way.

New §27.92 provides the to report issued by committee will contained determination concerning the distribution of project financial Irisk, which is defined as the allocation of revenue risk for toll project between the department and the private entity with which the department enters into a greement for the project. New §27.92 Iso provides that a report issued by committee will contain and determination concerning the method of financing for the project, which is defined as determination of whether the project should be funded with private or public funding or combination of private and public funding. Transportation Code, §228.013 does not define those provisions. The definitions in the new sections are consistent with the department's understanding that the purpose of the statute is to provide local and regional stakeholders with a symptopic terms that affect the risk of loss of local and regional funds committed to project.

New §27.92 provides th t report issued by committee will determin tion concerning the project's tolling Iso cont in structure nd methodology, unless the project is subject to region I tolling policy or the terms and conditions of a market v lu tion greement or m rket v lu tion w iver greement. Region I tolling policies h ve been dopted by cert in metropolit n pl nning org niz tions th t include, mong other things, policies on toll r tes nd toll r te esc I tion. The membership of metropolit n pl nning org niz tion's policy bo rd gener lly will include the municip lities, counties, nd loc I toll project entities th t would be p rt of committee est blished under Tr nsport tion Code, §228.013. Simil rly, m rket v lu tion greement or m rket v lu tion w iver greement will include greed terms and conditions for the development, construction, nd oper tion of toll project the tinclude toll retes and toll retes esc I tion.

New §27.92 provides the tife committee does not submit report by the diete the depirtment is scheduled to issue request for qualifications or request for proposals, as a pplicable, for project, the depirtment will use any business terms applicable to the project that have been dopted by the metropolitable normal principal or normal transfer of the determinations to be included in the report. As discussed bove, the membership of metropolitable normal principal pr

New §27.92 includes provisions rel ting to committee meetings nd dministr tive support of committee that reintended to ensure the efficient operation of the committee, including having division or office of the department schedule meetings for the committee and having the committee chair and the department finalize meeting gend s. Notices of meetings must comply with the requirements of the Open Meetings Act. The department shall provide information to the committee, including the project procurement schedule, necessary for committee to issue report in timely manner.

New §27.92 defines quorum of committee s one h If of the number of members ppointed to the committee, nd provides th t committee m y ct only by m jority vote of the members present t the meeting nd voting. These provisions will ensure th t committee is ble to c rry out its functions in timely m nner.

New §27.92 provides the tocommittee will consist the submitting its report, but the ten the depirtment may reconvene committee if changed circumstances may result in the committee's determinations.
