Hon. Jane Nelson, Texas Secretary of State and Chair, Border Trade Advisory Committee



**Hon. Jane Nelson** Texas Secretary of State and Chair, Border Trade Advisory Committee

Secretary Nelson is a businesswoman and former teacher who served two terms on the State Board of Education and 30 years as a State Senator representing North Texas.

The first woman in Texas legislative history to chair a standing budget-writing committee, Secretary Nelson was Chair of the Senate Finance Committee for four sessions. She was a member of the Senate State Affairs Committee, which oversees election policy, for eight sessions. She served as chair of the Sunset Advisory Commission, the Nominations Committee, the Select Committee on Cybersecurity and the Senate Health & Human Services Committee. She was also a member of the Legislative Budget Board, the Legislative Audit Committee and the Privacy Protection Advisory Council.

Secretary Nelson and her husband, J. Michael Nelson, owned and operated an aircraft component manufacturing company in Denton County. They have five children and 12 grandchildren.



**Hon. Kirk Watson** Mayor, City of Austin

Austin Mayor Kirk Watson has been immersed in public policy in both local and state government in Texas for over three decades. He won his first term as Austin mayor in 1997 and was reelected with 84% of the vote. He earned

praise for bringing different political factions together around transformative environmental and economic development initiatives. Watson returned to Austin City Hall in 2023 for a third term as mayor after serving more than 13 years in the Texas Senate, where he led on issues such as public education, healthcare and government transparency.

Watson was honored multiple times in Texas Monthly magazine's analysis of the state's best legislators. In 1998, the magazine described him as "a man with a vision of what the community wants — and the moxie to carry it out."

Since being sworn in last year, Mayor Watson has been focused on stabilizing city government and improving basic city operations. He has been a leader on addressing affordability in Austin, including by increasing housing stock and creating opportunities for more Austinites to participate in Austin's prosperity.

Mayor Watson's current priorities notably affordability, but also transportation, public safety and homelessness.

In July 2023, Watson brought together several community partners to work with representatives of the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs and the Governor's Office to address the City's homelessness crisis with a \$64 million partnership to increase shelter capacity in Austin.

Watson, who grew up in North Texas, graduated from Baylor University and Baylor Law School, where he graduated first in his class. He and his wife, Liz, have two adult sons and two delightful granddaughters.



Hon. Sarah Eckhardt

Senator, Texas Senate

Sarah Eckhardt is honored to have been elected the Senator for Travis County in July of 2020. Senator Eckhardt has deep roots in Central Texas and deep commitment to improving opportunity for all Texans. After receiving an LBJ School

Master of Public Affairs and law degree from the University of Texas at Austin in 1998, Eckhardt worked for eight years as an Assistant Travis County Attorney. From 2006-2013 she served as Travis County Commissioner representing 300,000 people. From 2015-2020 she served as the Travis County Judge presiding over the Commissioners Court and representing 1.3 million people.

Senator Eckhardt believes that elective office is a temporary trust bestowed by the people who elect her. She values policy above politics. And she believes that government exists to assure that opportunity is within reach of every Texan. Government should be effective, efficient, fair and minimally intrusive.

Eckhardt's public service experience includes emergency response, health care, workforce and economic development, criminal justice, water policy, transportation, and budget and finance. Some of her previous accomplishments include curtailing the spread of COVID-19 in Central Texas through early and decisive region-wide orders, preserving more than 30,000 acres of green space, building a multi-county collaboration for the preservation of groundwater, maintaining a vibrant construction economy while raising safety standards for workers, establishing a Travis County Public Defender's Office, and instituting jail and arrest diversion programs that support justice and public safety.

Senator Eckhardt learned public service from her mother and father and is inspired to continue serving by her son and daughter. Her mother Nadine Eckhardt and her father Congressman Bob Eckhardt served Texas and especially the most vulnerable Texans in the halls of the State Capitol and the US Capitol. Her children Nadine and Hank inspire her daily to make Texas a better place for generations to come.



**Hon. Andy Brown,**County Judge, Travis County

Judge Andy Brown oversees Travis County's \$1.4 billion annual budget as the County's chief administrator and Director of Emergency Management. Since taking office, he has prioritized resource allocation to historically

underserved communities, initiating a mass COVID-19 vaccination effort focused on communities of color. During winter storm Uri, he directed vital support to the hardest-hit areas and has emphasized investments in mental and behavioral health care, affordable housing, and increased transparency in County operations. Under his leadership, the Commissioners Court allocated \$110 million for homelessness initiatives, expected to create around 3,000 housing units in the area.

Before his tenure as Judge, Brown contributed to the establishment of the Sobering Center-Austin as an alternative to jail for intoxicated individuals and founded a successful law firm. He has a rich history of public service, having worked as a legislative aide, campaign manager, law clerk, finance director, and Travis County Democratic Party Chair. A lifelong Austin resident, he graduated from The University of Texas School of Law and lives with his wife, two children, a dog, a cat, and four chickens.



**Mr. Alvin New**Commissioner, Texas Transportation Commission, TxDOT

Alvin New is a member of the Texas Transportation Commission, which oversees statewide activities of the Texas Department of Transportation. New is a business

investor, rancher and former San Angelo Mayor. New is a lifelong resident of West Texas and was born in Brownfield. He has lived mostly in or near San Angelo since 1981.

New spent most of his career with Town & Country Food Stores. He started as a clerk while getting his business administration degree from Angelo State University. New worked his way up to chief executive officer and part owner. He and his partners sold their stake in the convenience store chain about a decade ago. He currently serves as a member of the Texas Tech University Foundation Board and the Goodfellow Air Force Base Advisory Council. New earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in management from Angelo State University. Commissioner New was appointed February 20, 2018, and re-appointed April 8, 2021. His second term will expire February 2027.



**Mr. Alejandro "Alex" G. Meade III**Commissioner, Texas Transportation Commission,
TxDOT

Alejandro "Alex" G. Meade III is a member of the Texas Transportation Commission, which oversees statewide activities of the Texas Department of Transportation. He

was appointed commissioner by Governor Greg Abbott on March 21, 2023. Meade, who lives in Mission, was appointed to serve on the commission for a term set to expire Feb. 1, 2025.

Meade is a Brownsville native, who previously served as the city manager of Pharr, where he managed a \$200 million budget and almost 700 employees. He also has served as the chief executive officer of the Mission Economic Development Corporation. His career also includes positions as principal of P3 Economics, an economic development consulting firm in Brownsville; the director of Economic Development at the Harlingen Area Chamber of Commerce; and private sector positions in accounting and management.

Meade, earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in economics from St. Edward's University. He earned a master's in business administration from the University of Texas at Brownsville, and a master's in public administration from the University of Texas-Pan American. He is certified as an Economic Development Finance Professional (EDFP) and is a Certified Public Manager (CPM). Meade is an alumnus of the Texas Lyceum and is a board member of the Border Trade Alliance, former board of regent for Texas State Technical College System, and a former member of the Texas Economic Development Corporation Board of Directors.



Mrs. Caroline A. Mays, AICP

Director, Planning and Modal Programs, TxDOT

Caroline Mays is a senior-level leader with more than 24 years of multimodal transportation planning, programing, policy, project development, and implementation experience at the local, regional, state, and international

levels, having held various leadership roles at all four levels.

Ms. Mays joined the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) in late 2012 and has held several positions. Ms. Mays is a member of TxDOT's senior leadership team and currently serves as the Director of Planning and Modal Programs. Humberto Hernandez-Haddad was born in Villahermosa, Tabasco, 19th July, 1951. His law degree from the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM). He received a National Prize "President Juarez" in 1972 for his

constitutional thesis "Constitutional Analysis of the Reform Laws promulgated by President Juarez. His influence on Mexican political thought." He was a Fellow 1977-1978 from the Center for International Affairs of Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts. He received his Master in International Public Policies from the School of advanced International Studies (SAIS) Johns Hopkins University, Washington, D.C, 1980-1981. The Government of the United States of America granted him the condecoration Commander's Award for Public Service, for his performance as Consul General of Mexico in the United States of America. He was previously the Consul General in San Antonio, Texas and is now serving as the Consul General of Mexico in Austin, Texas, since June 17th. of 2024.



Hon. Susan Harper

Consul General of Canada in Dallas

In November 2022, Susan became Consul General in Dallas, the senior representative of the Government in Canada, responsible for Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas. Her office, the Consulate General, covers

economic, political, and public affairs, and provides consular and commercial services. The Consulate of Canada in Houston, which focuses on commercial issues, also reports to her office. In addition, these offices coordinate with several other key federal government departments, which focus on a range of issues, including energy, environment, security and defense, as well as with Canadian provinces that are active in the territory.

Previously, Harper was Consul General in Miami, Canada's Senior Arctic Official, and Director General in the trade policy area, covering policy, negotiations and regulatory issues. She was at the Embassy of Canada in Washington DC, where she became the Minister (Economic Affairs). From 2001 to 2004, she was Canada's Ambassador in Montevideo, Uruguay. She previously held trade positions in Yaoundé, Paris and Buenos Aires.

An attorney by training, Barela worked at New Mexico's largest law firm and specialized in civil litigation. He also served as New Mexico's Assistant Attorney General and Director of the Civil Division.
